

Orient Star Launches New M45 F7 Small Second Models Offering Ideal Simplicity for Everyday Use

Orient Star has launched a new 75th anniversary M45 F7 Small Second model limited to 500 pieces, and two regular models, from the Classic Collection M45. The Classic Collection M45 features classical designs inspired by the Pleiades star cluster, or “Subaru” in Japan, reflecting the idea of time’s eternal flow. The new models feature the simplest dials and most compact cases in the collection, making them ideal for any occasion from business to casual.

Blending the timeless appeal of classical watch design with the precision of high-performance, high-quality in-house movements, the Classic Collection M45 has earned widespread acclaim as Orient Star's flagship collection. The M45 F7 Small Second highlights simplicity and compactness.

The dual-layered dial is composed simply of hour and minute hands, power reserve indicator and small seconds, with no calendar display. The dial, with leaf-shaped hour and minute hands, delicate Roman numerals and railway-track minute scale, features a matte texture created through sandblast and sunburst finishes. In contrast, the brand's iconic power reserve indicator features a simple sandblast finish that achieves visual uniformity and distinctness. The small second subdial at 6 o'clock adorned with a detailed circumferential pattern gives the dial a sense of depth. The 75th anniversary limited-edition model features a combination of fine granular texture and matte finishing on the grey dial conjuring the image of stardust, or a scene of stars gently twinkling in the night sky.

The dual-curved sapphire crystal with anti-reflective SAR-coating on both sides of the glass provides a 99% transmittance rate, ensuring that every facet of the dials on the 75th anniversary limited-edition and regular models can be seen clearly.

The high-quality stainless steel (SUS316L) case has a diameter of 39 mm and a thickness of 11.7 mm for ease of wear. The compact size fits comfortably under shirt or jacket sleeves. The slim case is equipped with an in-house automatic calibre F7H44 with small second and no date display. The high-quality movement offering stable high accuracy of +15 seconds to -5 seconds per day and a power reserve of 50 hours is visible through the sapphire crystal see-through caseback. The 75th anniversary limited-edition model is engraved with the words "Orient Star 75th Anniversary" and serial number on the caseback.

With a timeless design that suits every occasion, compact size for easy wearability and high-quality automatic movement, the M45 F7 Small Second is the ideal basic timepiece for everyday use.

- 1991 Mon Bijou* is launched, a skeleton model of high-quality and aesthetic appeal.
- 1996 The power reserve indicator, now an iconic feature of the brand, is integrated into the design.
- 2017 Orient Watch Co. Ltd. merges with [Seiko Epson Corporation](#), a company with a strong watchmaking heritage and focus on precision engineering. Both organisations share a vision for innovation and high-quality design and craftsmanship creating a strong foundation for the future growth of Orient Star.
- 2017 Mechanical Moon Phase, a cosmic timekeeper is launched as a symbol of this new collaboration. This marks a new era of watchmaking for Orient Star brand.

- 2021 The Skeleton is launched mounted with an in-house developed silicon escape wheel for longer power reserve and beauty, incorporating design inspired by the vast universe.
- 2026 Orient Star celebrates its 75th anniversary. A limited edition M34 F8 Date with a meteorite dial is launched bringing the profound mysteries of the universe closer.
